Unit 1	11	aunt	the sister of your mother or father, or the wife of your uncle	Ysabella's uncle and aunt are in the circus, too.

Unit 1	11	cousin	the child of your aunt or uncle	Lucas and Thomas are cousins.
Unit 1	11	dad	a male parent	Is it your dad?

Unit 1	11	grandad	the father of a person's mother or father	My dad's dad is my grandad.

Unit 1	16	Are you alright?	used to ask about someone's physical or emotional state	Hi, Lily. Are you alright?
Unit 1	16	Cool!	used for saying that you think something is good or acceptable	Cool! I've got a new boy in my class.
Unit 1	16	Got to go!	used when you must leave somewhere	Got to go! Bye!
Unit 1	16	That's funny!	used to say that something is strange, surprising, unexpected, or peculiar	That's funny! Maybe it's the same boy.
Unit 1	16	That's so not funny!	used to say something isn't humorous or making you laugh	That's so not funny, Evan!
Unit 1	16	Bye!	goodbye	Bye, see you tomorrow.
Unit 1	16	Hey.	used as a greeting	Hey, Evan.
Unit 1	16	Hi!	used as an informal greeting, usually to people who you know	Hi, how are you doing?
Unit 1	16	How are things?	informal for "how are you?"	Ok. Thanks. How are things?
Unit 1	16	OK/Fine, thanks. You?	used to say you are well or happy and then ask another person how they are	Ok, thanks. You?

Unit 1	17	Email me soon.	used at the end of an email to tell the other person you would like them to reply soon	Email me soon, Javi.
Unit 1	17	That's all for now.	used when you've finished what you were saying or discussing, usually when you might have more to say later	That's all for now.
Unit 1	17	Write soon!	used at the end of a letter or email to tell the other person you would like them to reply soon	Write soon! Javi
