Unit 2	29	comma ,	komma ,	the symbol, used in writing to separate parts of a sentence showing a slight pause, or to separate the single things in a list	I have a chair, a table and a notebook in my room.
Unit 2	29	capital letter A, B, C	Hoofdletter A, B, C	a large letter of the alphabet used at the beginning of sentences and names	She is Amy Ritchie. She is Canadian.
Unit 2	29	exclamation mark !	uitroepteken !	a mark (!) used at the end of a sentence that expresses surprise	One day I want to be a vlogger like Amy!
