Unit 6	71	be bitten	to have an insect injure you and make a small hole in your skin	I was bitten by a mosquito.
Unit 6	71	be stung	to have a small but painful injury, usually with poison, done to you by an animal or plant	Andy was stung by a bee.
Unit 6	71	break	to (cause something to) separate suddenly or violently into two or more pieces, or to (cause something to) stop working by being damaged	You can slip and break your leg.
Unit 6	71	bruise	to have a dark area on your skin where you have been hurt	He crashed into a table and bruised his shin.
Unit 6	71	burn	to be hurt by fire or heat	Did Lisa burn her hand?
Unit 6	71	cut	to injure yourself on a sharp object that makes you bleed	You can step on some glass and cut your foot.
Unit 6	71	fall off	to suddenly go down onto the ground or towards the ground without intending to or by accident	You can really hurt yourself if you fall off.
Unit 6	71	hit	to touch someone or something quickly and with force, usually causing injury or damage	I hit my head.
Unit 6	71	scratch	to rub your skin with your nails, often to stop it itching	He was scratching his mosquito bites.
Unit 6	71	slip	to slide by accident and fall or almost fall	Juan slipped on some ice.
Unit 6	71	sprain	to injure part of your body by twisting it, but not so badly that it breaks	What should you do with a sprained ankle?
Unit 6	71	trip over	to lose your balance because your foot hits against something when you are walking or running	He tripped over a chair.
Unit 6	74	cheek	the soft part of your face below your eye	He pecked his aunt on the cheek.
Unit 6	74	chest	the front of your body between your neck and your waist	He folded his arms across his chest.

Unit 6	74	elbow	the part in the middle of your arm where it bends	She wiped the beads of sweat from her forehead.
Unit 6	74	forehead	the part of your face between your eyes and your hair	Your forehead is just above your eyes.
Unit 6	74	heel	the back part of your foot	My shoe is rubbing on my heel.
Unit 6	74	knee	the middle part of your leg where it bends	All skateboarders should wear knee and elbow pads as well.
