Unit 5	59	boot	laars	a strong shoe that covers your foot and part of your leg	I'm wearing big black boots.
Unit 5	59	cap	pet	a hat with a curved part at the front	He usually wears a cap but he isn't wearing it in this photo.
Unit 5	59	flip-flop	teenslippers	a type of open shoe, often made of rubber, with a V-shaped strap that goes between the big toe and the toe next to it	Flip-flops have a lot of different names around the world.
Unit 5	59	hoodie	hoodie	a sweatshirt (= cotton clothing for the upper body) that has a hood to cover the head	I'm wearing beige trousers and a grey hoodie.
Unit 5	59	jacket	jas	a short coat	She's wearing a white T-shirt and a woollen jacket.
Unit 5	59	jeans	spijkerbroek	trousers made of denim, a strong cotton material, which are worn informally	I always wear jeans on Sunday.
Unit 5	59	joggers	trainingsbroek	loose informal trousers that fit tightly around the ankles that are worn for running	I always wear joggers on Saturday.
Unit 5	59	shirt	overhemd	a piece of clothing worn on the top part of the body, made of light cloth and usually having a collar and buttons at the front	Emily isn't making a shirt.
Unit 5	59	shorts	korte broek	trousers that end above the knee or reach the knee	He's wearing grey shorts.
Unit 5	59	skirt	rok	a piece of clothing for women and girls that hangs from the waist and does not have legs	The bride usually wears a long skirt and a long scarf.
Unit 5	59	T-shirt	T-shirt	a piece of clothing for the top part of the body with short sleeves and no collar	He's wearing a black and white striped T-shirt.
Unit 5	59	trainers	sportschoenen	a type of light, comfortable shoe that is suitable for playing sport	He's wearing his favourite checked shirt and his new trainers.
Unit 5	62	belt	riem	a long, thin piece of leather, cloth, or plastic that you wear around your waist	She's now making a skirt and a belt.
Unit 5	62	bracelet	armband	a piece of jewellery that you wear around your wrist	She's wearing lots of red and gold bracelets.

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Unit 5	62	earring	oorbel	a piece of jewellery that you wear on or through your ear	She always wears earrings.
Unit 5	62	glove	handschoen	a piece of clothing that covers your fingers and hand	I have lots of hats, gloves and scarves.
Unit 5	62	necklace	ketting	a piece of jewellery that you wear around your neck	She always wears a gold necklace.
Unit 5	62	purse	handtas	a small container for money, usually used by a woman	Most people keep their money in a purse or wallet.
Unit 5	62	ring	ring	a round piece of jewellery that you wear on your finger	She is wearing rings on her fingers and toes.
Unit 5	62	scarf	sjaal	a piece of cloth that you wear around your neck, head, or shoulders to keep warm or for decoration	Where is my scarf? It's cold outside.
Unit 5	62	sunglasses	zonnebril	dark glasses that you wear to protect your eyes from the sun	It's sunny, so she's wearing a T-shirt and sunglasses.
Unit 5	62	umbrella	paraplu	a thing that you hold above your head to keep yourself dry when it is raining	You use an umbrella in the rain.
Unit 5	62	wallet	portemonnee	a small folding case for carrying paper money and credit cards	When did you lose your wallet?
Unit 5	62	watch	horloge	a small clock which is worn on a strap around the wrist	I don't wear a watch.
Unit 5	64	bargain	koopje	something on sale at a lower price than its true value	Are you sure? It's a bargain.
Unit 5	64	perfect	perfect	exactly right for someone or something	It's perfect! How much is it?
Unit 5	64	honestly	eerlijk	used to emphasise that you are telling the truth	No, honestly. One is fine.
Unit 5	64	You're in luck!	Je hebt geluk!	to be able to have or do what you want	Yes, I have. You're in luck!
Unit 5	64	Can I see ...?	Mag ik ... even zien?	used to ask if you are able to look at something, often in a shop when you are thinking of buying something	Can I see the purple one, please?
